Basic Description and/or History of the Organization:

Doctors Hospital has provided healthcare services to the CSRA for over 25 years. The Joseph M. Still Burn Center is one of the largest in the nation. It is part of the HCA Healthcare Corporation with 59 dedicated burn and wound beds. This facility provides a number of services to include Breast Cancer Center, Burn Center, Diabetes Center, Emergency Dept, Endoscopy, Hyperbarics, MRI, Lab, Mammography, Sports Medicine, Pulmonary Medicine Rehab Center, Sleep Disorders, and Vascular Lab, to name a few.

Basic Description of the Key Populations Being Served:

The Burn and Wound Center provides care to patients coming from as many as 5 surrounding states. There is a 16 bed ICU, a Cardiac Cath Lab, Bronchoscopy Lab, Breast Diagnostic Center Cardiopulmonary Center, Human Motion Institute, and Sports Medicine Department.

Areas of Special Clinical Interest and Capabilities:

Most clinical research for Doctors Hospital is conducted in the Burn Center; however, patient screening for a number of other studies is carried out in any applicable clinical care area. The types of studies conducted range from Sepsis Trials, Antibiotic Comparator Studies, Burn and Wound Studies, Device Studies, ARDs trials, Pain Studies and Sedation Studies to name a few.

Basic Description and/or History of the Organization:

Augusta is a two-division Medical Center that provides tertiary care in medicine, surgery, neurology, psychiatry, rehabilitation medicine, and spinal cord injury. The Downtown Division is authorized 155 beds (58 medicine, 37 surgery, and 60 spinal cord injury). The Uptown Division, located approximately three miles away, is authorized 285 beds (68 psychiatry, 60 domiciliary, 15 blind rehabilitation and a 142 Restorative Care Center comprised of 132 nursing home care beds and 10 rehabilitation beds).

Through the Joint Venture for Shared Services agreement with Eisenhower Army Medical Center at Fort Gordon, Army surgeons perform neurosurgery at the Augusta V AMC for both VA patients and DoD beneficiaries. In addition, Cardio-thoracic surgery is performed at Eisenhower Army Medical Center for VA and DoD patients by Army surgeons. The Joint Venture of Shared Services provides for the cost-effective sharing of resources between these two federal health care facilities. The medical center enjoys a strong affiliation with the Medical College of Georgia. The Augusta V AMC provides medical and allied health training to an average of more than 1000 students and residents annually. Additional health training affiliations exist with 50 academic institutions.

In 1986, the State of Georgia awarded a Certificate of Need for the creation of a physical rehabilitation hospital to serve the population within a 90-mile radius of Augusta, Georgia. In March of 1988, Walton Rehabilitation Hospital opened its doors and received accreditations from CARF and JCAHO. Today, Walton Rehabilitation Health System is a regional provider, accepting referrals from the entire Southeast and now includes a complete continuum of physical medicine and rehabilitation services,

The cornerstone of the continuum is Walton Rehabilitation Hospital, which offers acute medical rehabilitation programs, as well as physical, occupational and speech therapy, as appropriate. The continuum then extends through our clients' lifetime with the outpatient rehabilitation, community re-entry, physician services, pain and headache management, independent and assisted living services and a variety of accessible residential options. Services offered range from inpatient and outpatient programs for persons recovering from stroke, head injuries, spinal cord injuries, orthopedic injuries, chronic pain and other disabling illnesses and injuries to community re-entry, assisted living and wellness programs.
